## 2. WHY AMERICANS WANT TO MOVE TO CANADA

Each year, many Americans make the decision to immigrate to Canada. In the past couple of years, more Americans have been searching online for information on moving to Canada - the night of the U.S. 2016 presidential election Americans crashed the Canada immigration website looking for information on how to move to Canada from the United States, and that trend continued during the 2020 presidential campaign.

There are many reasons for an American citizen to move to Canada temporarily or permanently:

- For better economic opportunity and quality of life
- To start a business in Canada
- They are sponsored by a spouse or partner
- To study in Canada
- They are transferred by an American company to a work in Canada on a temporary basis
- To take an extended holiday in Canada
- To work temporarily in Canada
- To join family in Canada





## How to Enter Canada

U.S. citizens who can show a passport at the border do not need a Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) or an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), which is required of residents of all other countries.

Canadian law requires that anyone who enters Canada from the U.S. by car, train, boat or plane must present both proof of citizenship and identity. A U.S. passport meets both of these requirements for American citizens.

A U.S. passport is the preferred and recommended identification for Americans to enter Canada:

- If you are traveling with minor children and share custody of your children you should carry copies of your legal custody documents, such as custody rights, as well as a notarized letter of consent by the non-accompanying parent.
- If you are traveling with a pet, the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) requires animal permits or certificates, depending on the type of pet, and establishes import requirements for all pets entering Canada permanently or temporarily, and may require a veterinarian visit upon entering Canada.

American citizens have several avenues to move to Canada:

- Permanent Residence
- Temporary Work Permit
- Study Permit
- NAFTA
- Family Sponsorship
- Professional Internships

# 3. EXPRESS ENTRY- PERMANENT RESIDENCE APPLICATION

Express Entry (EE) is currently the fastest way for foreign workers to become a Canadian Permanent Resident. American citizens can apply to move to Canada via Express Entry without need for employment sponsorship. Express Entry was launched by the Canadian Government on January 1, 2015 to identify and select skilled immigrants as Permanent Residents to Canada based on likelihood to successfully settle in Canada. Though it is a good program, the Express Entry process is confusing, and a legal expert is often a great resource to guide you through your application to ensure success.

Express Entry is a points-based system used to rank applications for Permanent Residence under three federal economic immigration programs:

- Federal Skilled Worker Program
- Canadian Experience Class
- Federal Skilled Trades Program

Provinces and Territories can also recruit candidates from the Express Entry system through their Provincial Nominee Programs to meet local labour market needs. You must have a score of at least 67 points out of a possible 100 Selection Factor criteria before you apply under Express Entry Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS).

Step 1 - Potential Candidates must complete an Online Express Entry Profile called an Expression of Interest

Step 2 - The highest-ranking candidates in the pool will be issued an Invitation to Apply (ITA) for Permanent Residence

Candidates will be ranked against others in the pool using a points-based system called the Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS). Generally, twice a month a draw occurs, and points are awarded based on age, language skills, level of education and adaptability. The CRS assigns applicants a score up to 1200 points, and the cut-off varies from draw to draw but is typically 475 to 495.

You can increase your points by:

- having a Canadian job offer with or without a Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA)
- needed skills and experience
- testing for English and French language knowledge
- obtaining a nomination by a Province or Territory
- obtaining a Canadian degree, diploma or certificate
- having strong French language skills, with more additional points going to candidates who also have English language skills, or
- having siblings in Canada

These additional points could cause a candidate to rank high enough to be invited to apply at the next eligible round of invitations.

Once candidates receive an ITA, they will have 60 days to submit an online application for Permanent Residence. There are no extensions to this timeline and a candidate who is unable to submit all the required documents within the 60 days' period will lose the ITA.

IRCC will process most complete applications (meaning those with all the necessary supporting documents and information) in six months or less since the application has been determined to be complete.

Candidates remain in the pool for up to 12 months. If they do not receive an ITA for permanent residence within 12 months of submitting an Expression of Interest, they must submit a new profile to re-enter the pool and start again.

### **Express Entry - Permanent Residence - Federal Skilled Worker**

Express Entry was created to allow foreign skilled workers to enter Canada much more rapidly than in the past. It works by allowing employers and government officers to choose the immigrants based on their skill set and on Canada's needs. Under this system, prospective immigrants would apply to express their interest in coming to Canada by providing details about their professional skills, their education and languages spoken.

The minimum requirements for the Federal Skilled Worker category are as follows:

- Must have 67/100 points at the initial qualification review
- Have at least one year (1,560 hours) of work in your field
- It must be paid employment
- Experience must be in National Occupational Classification (NOC) skill type (0, A or B) - skilled, managerial or executive
- Your experience must have occurred in the past ten years



There are also language requirements that must be met, educational requirements, and CRS that must all be met before you may qualify. These include the already mentioned, your age, a valid job offer, and more. There is also an economic requirement that must be met, and you must be admissible to Canada.

Once you qualify for the Federal Skilled Workers Program, you must then apply for permanent residence under Express Entry. But to do that, you will need to be invited to do so. Find out if you qualify for the Federal Skilled Workers Program [here](#).

There are no specific lists of requirements because each applicant is unique. The IRCC says, "When you have completed the application, the system will generate a personalized Document Checklist for you. It will show all the supporting documents you need to upload."

Candidates who meet the minimum entry criteria for Express Entry will be automatically placed into the pool and immediately eligible for invitation rounds. If they do not currently have a job in Canada and would like to start their job search, they will be able to register for the Job Bank.

### **Express Entry - Permanent Residence - Federal Skilled Trades**

The Federal Skilled Trades program was created for those seeking to become Permanent Residents based on their qualifications in a specific skilled trade. There are minimum requirements that must be met:

- No plans to live in the Province of Quebec as it does not use this system
- Language skills at the necessary minimum benchmark levels
- Two full years of full-time experience in a skilled trade



- An offer of full-time employment must be made (for at least one year of employment) or a "certificate of qualification in that skilled trade issued by a Canadian provincial or territorial authority" must be available
- The job must meet the criteria for skilled trades as laid out by the NOC (these are Major Group 72, industrial, electrical and construction trades; Major Group 73, maintenance and equipment operation trades; Major Group 82, supervisors and technical jobs in natural resources, agriculture and related production; Major Group 92, processing, manufacturing and utilities supervisors and central control operators; Minor Group 632, chefs and cooks; and Minor Group 633, butchers and bakers)

If you believe you qualify for the Federal Skilled Trades Program, we suggest you speak with an immigration legal expert to confirm your eligibility.



## Express Entry - Permanent Residence - Canadian Experience Class

To qualify for the Express Entry Canadian Experience Class, the candidate would need to have at least one year of work experience in Canada within the last three years prior to submitting the application. The experience would have to be in Canada and with proper authorization. The skilled work done in Canada must also meet the Canadian National Occupational Classifications (NOC):

- Managerial jobs (NOC skill level 0)
- Professional jobs (NOC skill type A); or
- Technical jobs and skilled trades (NOC skill type B)

Your initial EE application places you into a pool with other eligible workers. There, you are all ranked and if you meet the minimum necessary cut off points, you may receive an ITA via Express Entry.

## 4. IMMIGRATION TO CANADA UNDER THE GLOBAL TALENT STREAM

The Global Talent Stream was in 2017 as a two-year pilot under the Temporary Foreign Worker (TFW) program and became permanent in 2019. The IRCC Global Talent Stream promises a 2-week fast-track for qualified applicants to the TFW Program. The Global Talent Stream's goal is to provide innovative firms in Canada with a faster way to hire highly skilled foreign talent when Canadians or permanent residents are not available, and help approved companies recruit and hire the highly specialized and skilled global talent they need to expand by providing faster and more predictable application processing.

IRCC has announced a strategy to set a two-week standard for processing visas and work permits for high-skill talent for companies doing business in Canada. This initiative will target high-skilled workers outside Canada in National Occupational Classification (NOC) codes 0 and A.

There has also been a new short-duration work permit exemption introduced for short term research for work of less than 15 or 30 days in a year for NOC 0 and A positions with academic research terms of 120 days or less.

## Two types of companies are eligible to apply for The Global Talent Stream:

### Category A:

Firms in Canada that are referred to the Temporary Foreign Worker Program's Global Talent Stream by an Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) Designated Partner because they are innovative and can demonstrate a need to hire unique and specialized temporary foreign workers to scale-up and grow.

### Category B:

Firms in Canada that need to hire foreign workers for highly skilled in-demand occupations found on ESDC's Global Talent Occupations List where there is insufficient domestic labour supply.

Employers seeking to hire workers through the Global Talent Stream program must pay a \$1,000 fee for each position and can't make temporary foreign workers pay that fee. Employers are encouraged to recruit Canadians and permanent residents before offering a job to a temporary foreign worker.

The Global Talent Stream is key to the IRCC Global Skills Strategy which promotes global investment in Canada to support the Government of Canada's Innovation Agenda which offers:

- a two-week processing time for 80% of work permit applications
- work permit exemptions for highly skilled workers on short-term work assignments and for researchers involved in a short-duration research project in Canada
- a dedicated service channel for companies looking to make large, job-creating investments in Canada





## 5. IMMIGRATION TO CANADA FROM THE U.S. UNDER USMCA

The United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA, aka NAFTA 2.0) has created benefits for U.S. citizens who want to enter Canada for business. USMCA allows citizens of the U.S. to quickly and easily enter Canada for investment or business reasons are three key ways you can obtain a work permit under USMCA:

## 1. USMCA Professional Work Permits

A degreed professional may qualify for a Canadian work permit if they have a job offer or consulting contract.

- Professionals will have to be qualified and expected to work in one of the jobs designated under the USMCA arrangement. There are currently 63 designated professions, such as physicians and dentists, scientists, teachers, engineers, accountants, lawyers and management consultants.
- Citizens of the U.S. must have an Offer of Employment from a Canadian business before they can apply for a work permit at the point of entry that includes details of the position including the title, duties, duration of employment and payment arrangements and the required educational qualifications.

Professional business visitors to Canada cannot be self-employed. USMCA professional work permit holders may apply for permanent residence status in Canada through the Federal Skilled Worker (FSW) Program or the Canadian Experience Class or through a Provincial Nomination Program.

## 2. USMCA Intra-Company Transfers

An American company can transfer workers to a Canadian branch or subsidiary or affiliate of the U.S. firm. Intra-company transferees must meet the following requirements:

- Prove they are transferring from the same or a related company outside of Canada
- Must be employed by the company and have worked for a specified minimum period, typically one of the past 3 years.
- Have specialized knowledge or management experience

### 3. USMCA Traders and Investors

Americans who are investing in a Canadian business and want to immigrate to Canada from the U.S. under the category Trader and Investor must meet the following requirements:

- Work at a planning or executive level
- Their firm must have a large investment in Canada
- A work permit is required. Staff of an American company can transfer to a Canadian branch of the firm.

Under Express Entry changes that were introduced in November 2016, work permit holders under USMCA may be eligible for bonus points in their permanent residency candidacy.



## 6. IMMIGRATION TO CANADA FROM THE U.S. - WORK PERMIT

For occupations not included in the USMCA Professional category or the USMCA Intra-Company category, a Canadian employer must obtain a Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA) before they can offer a job to an American, a process which takes about four months to complete.

### Labour Market Impact Assessment Applications

The Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA) is a document that is prepared by Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) upon a request by a Canadian employer. The employer will make this request, along with paying a processing fee of \$1,000 to the government. The employer must prove that there is a demonstrated need for a foreign worker to fill the job and that no Canadian worker is available or qualified to do it. After reviewing the labour market in the location of the job opportunity, ESDC may issue a positive decision on the LMIA. A positive LMIA decision will qualify you to apply for a Work Permit.

### Do You Need an LMIA to Obtain a Work Permit?

Though the IRCC says that in "most cases" an employer must obtain a LMIA to hire a temporary foreign worker, there are many exceptions.

## Exemptions from the LMIA Requirements:

The exemptions from the LMIA requirements apply to three different categories:

- When hiring foreign workers through specific international trade agreements (like NAFTA)
- A long list of groups that include charitable work, reciprocal employment, specially designated programs, and more
- "Other" categories R206-R208

Additionally, employers who fit within the criteria may hire workers through the International Mobility Program without the need for an LMIA. The employer must submit an online application called an Offer of Employment and pay a \$230 Compliance Fee through their Employer Portal.





## 7. MOVING TO CANADA FROM THE U.S. WITH A STUDY PERMIT

To study in Canada, American students usually require a study permit. You may apply for a Study Permit only after a college, university, or other accredited educational institution has accepted you. The school must be a Designated Learning Institution (DLI). Study permits are only available for those accepted into schools designated to accept international students.

DLIs are on the official Designated Learning Institutions' list, but only at the post-secondary level. Primary and secondary schools throughout the country are automatically deemed as designated institutions.

Once a prospective student determines which schools are designated and is accepted into one, he or she must then put together the appropriate documentation to apply for his or her study permit. Not all students technically require a study permit; if the program is less than six months, you will not require a study permit.

However, it is advisable to obtain a study permit because it will allow you to obtain a "work permit" allowing you to work part-time on campus and possibly off-campus when you are a full-time student.

## The Essential Documents

After you receive a letter of acceptance from a Canadian college, you can [apply for a study permit online](#). For your application you will need:

- A valid passport, in most cases
- A letter of acceptance from the university stating your program of study and start and end dates
- Proof that you have enough money to support yourself and your dependents during your entire stay in Canada
- A letter from your sponsoring organization, if you are being sponsored
- Required biometrics

There is an application fee to apply for a study permit.

## When You Arrive in Canada

Canada immigration officials will ask to see these documents:

- Your study permit (Form IMM1294)
- A valid passport
- A visitor visa (if required)
- All documents used to obtain your study permit





## 8. IMMIGRATION TO CANADA FROM THE U.S. THROUGH THE PARENTS AND GRANDPARENTS SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

Canada residents can sponsor their parents or grandparents to become Permanent Residents throughout the Parents and Grandparents Sponsorship Program (PGP). In 2020, IRCC launched a new lottery system for the Parents and Grandparents Sponsorship Program and there will be 10,000 available PGP spots in 2020 and 30,000 in 2021.

## Sponsorship Eligibility

A U.S. citizen can be sponsored to immigrate to Canada by a Canadian child or grandchild if they meet the following requirements:

- are 18 years of age or older
- be a Canadian citizen, Registered Indian or permanent resident
- live in Canada
- sign an undertaking promising to provide for the basic requirements of the person being sponsored
- sign an agreement with the person who is sponsoring you that confirms that each of you understands your mutual obligations and responsibilities
- prove that they have sufficient income to provide the basic requirements for family members in Canada as well as the persons included in their sponsorship undertaking. They may also have a co-signer.





## 9. IMMIGRATION TO CANADA FROM THE U.S. WITH A SUPER VISA

### The Parents and Grandparents Extended Stay Temporary Resident Visa

This is also known as a Super Visa. A Super Visa lets you visit your children or grandchildren for up to 2 years and is only available to someone who is either the parent or grandparent of a Canadian citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada. A Super Visa is valid for up to 10 years.

To qualify for a Super Visa, you must meet the following requirements:

- Be able to demonstrate the relationship claimed
- Have a letter of invitation from the child/grandchild in Canada
- Meet several other criteria, including income, medical coverage and more







## 10. IMMIGRATION TO CANADA FROM THE U.S. THROUGH THE ENTREPRENEUR START-UP VISA PROGRAM

The Entrepreneur Start-up Visa Program focuses on entrepreneurs who want to immigrate to Canada. Specifically, those who can build businesses and create jobs for Canadians and Permanent Residents. Canada's Start-up Visa Program has finished a 5-year pilot program and became permanent in 2018.

To be eligible for the Start-up Visa you must:

- Have a Letter of Support from a designated angel investor group (must secure at least \$75,000 in support from this group) or venture capital fund (must secure at least \$200,000 from this group) or business incubator (no initial investment from this group required)
- Have a business that meets the ownership requirements
- Ownership requirements for the Entrepreneur Start-Up Visa Program are:
  - Up to 5 people can apply for a Start-up Visa
  - Each of those applicants must have at least 10% of voting rights or more in that Start-up
  - The designated angel investor group or venture capital fund or business incubator and the applicants must jointly hold more than 50% of the voting rights
  - Meet the Canadian language benchmark (CLB) 5 in all four categories (reading, writing, listening and speaking) in either English or French; and
  - Must meet the low-income threshold as set by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada and provide for the cost of living before earning any income.
  - The application fee for the primary applicant is \$1050 not including the right of Permanent Residence fee (\$490)

# 11. IMMIGRATION TO CANADA FROM THE U.S. THROUGH THE INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE PROGRAM

Young Professionals who have been enrolled in a full-time, post-secondary educational program in the past year may be able to receive an open work permit for Canada. The permits, issued under the International Experience Canada (IEC) program, last for 12 months and are available for those aged 18 to 35. They are intended to help foreign workers get professional development and Canadian professional work experience to compete in the global economy.

The Young Professionals category requirements are:

- You have a job offer in Canada that contributes to your professional development
- You'll work for the same employer in the same location during your stay in Canada
- The work must be paid
- You cannot be not self-employed

Your employer must meet all labour laws of the province or territory you plan to work in, including meeting minimum wage requirements.

The job you are offered in Canada must be classified as a National Occupational Classification (NOC) Code Skill Type Level 0, A or B to be considered as contributing to your “professional development.” A NOC C job might be accepted if you can submit a post-secondary diploma, certificate or degree, with your work permit application. Your diploma, certificate or degree must be translated to English or French.

## International Co-op Internship

Americans can get valuable Canadian work experience related to your field of study with a work permit in the International Co-op (Internship) category, an employer-specific work permit. Your internship must be directly linked to your field of studies and classified as a National Occupational Classification (NOC) Code Skill Type Level 0, A or B to be considered. A NOC job might also be accepted if your internship is directly linked to your field of studies with a post-secondary institution in your country.

International Co-op Internship requirements include:

- You're a student registered at a post-secondary institution
- You have a job offer for a work placement or internship in Canada
- You need to do this work placement or internship to complete your studies
- You'll work for the same employer in the same location during your stay in Canada

Wages must follow the labour laws in the province or territory you will be working in. The labour code of the province or territory will determine if an internship needs to be paid or not.

Employment and labour law standards apply to all foreign nationals in Canada. It is up to the IEC candidates and their Canadian employer to inquire, for their particular case, with the relevant provincial or territorial departments regarding labour standards.



## 12. THE CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP TEST

The requirements to become a Canadian citizen are outlined by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). If you are 14 - 64 years old when you apply for citizenship, you must take the Canada citizenship test. All the test questions are based on the free Discover Canada guide. Applicants must study this guide to prepare for the test. The guide is available in both English and French. The time and place of the test is provided once your application is processed.

The qualifications to take the Canada Citizenship Test include:

- Be the proper age - you must be 18 or older. Anyone under 18 must have an application made for the minor by a parent or guardian. The minor must already be a permanent resident of Canada.
- Must have permanent residence status - this is the first step to becoming a Canadian citizen; you must have already obtained permanent residence status.
- Time in Canada - to be eligible for citizenship in Canada, the Applicant must have been in Canada (i.e., physically present) for at least 1,460 days during the six years immediately before the date of application. Specifically, the individual must be present for at least 183 days during each of four calendar years that are fully or partially within the six years immediately before the date of application.
- Income tax compliance - only those who can demonstrate that they have met personal income tax filing requirements for four years within the six years before the application may qualify for citizenship.
- Show intent to reside in Canada - declaring your intent to reside is mandatory and means that you will live in Canada.
- Pass language criteria - citizens must be proficient in one of the two official languages - either French or English. Specific levels of skill apply, and a formal test is given to allow the applicant to demonstrate proficiency.
- You do not have prohibitions against you - crimes committed outside or inside of Canada may negate your ability to become a citizen.

These criteria must all be met prior to filing your citizenship application. If you have served in the Canadian Armed Forces, the “fast track process” may be more appropriate for you. There are two standard application kits - those for Adults and those for Minors.

Adults can apply for their children at the same time they apply for their own citizenship. All applications require the submission of various supporting documents and fees. Fees are payable only in Canadian funds and may be submitted via the online option or at specific financial institutions. After you apply, you will be contacted to take the formal Citizenship Test.

Passing the citizenship test is the final step to allow you to receive a ceremony date. You will take the Oath of Citizenship and become a full citizen at the Citizenship Ceremony. If you do not pass, you are able to take a second test later

As you might guess, there is a great deal involved, and it is always best that you speak with an immigration expert if you have concerns about your citizenship application in Canada.
